AFFIDAVIT OF ANGIE SHARP

The undersigned, Angie Sharp, being first duly sworn, hereby states as follows:

1. I, Angie Sharp, am over the age of 18, am of sound mind, and have personal knowledge of the matters set forth in this affidavit.

2. Beginning in the late 1970s or early 1980s, I worked for Dygert Seating on Decio Dr. and later moved to its seat manufacturing facility on Marina Dr., Elkhart, IN ("Seat Shop").

3. During my first time of employment with Dygert Seating, I worked for approximately ten years, then I left my employment with Dygert Seating and became self-employed as a tile-setter.

4. In approximately 1991, my younger brother, Wesley Harman, got me another job with Dygert Seating at the Seat Shop and I began to work in the shipping department.

5. I continued my employment with Dygert Seating and later Flexsteel for approximately ten years and had positions in shipping and quality assurance.

6. When I worked in quality insurance, I used a tin can full of solvent to clean the grease off the furniture before it was sent to shipping.

7. At some point in time, Greg Gaskill approached me and asked me to sign a piece paper acknowledging that the solvent I was using was dangerous.

8. Greg Gaskill told me that he wanted me to sign the paper so that I would not come back on Dygert Seating if something happened to me.

9. I told him no because I had already been working with the solvent and the damage was already done.

10. I remember that there were drums outside the southwest corner of the building that were used as trash receptacles, but I do not recall if they were cardboard or not.

11. I do remember that on occasion the drums outside the southwest corner would overflow and there would be rags and other trash on the ground.

12. I also remember and personally witnessed employees from installation cleaning the glue pots outside in the south and southwest corner of the building and dumping the solvent on the ground.

13. I also remember and personally witnessed employees putting solvent into glue guns and spraying it through the nozzle and shooting it out the back door to clean the nozzle.

6. She asked me what I did with the solvent and how I handled my contaminated rags.
7. She also told me that there was no proof that any chemicals had been found in the ground.
8. I told her, I know what I know and I know what I saw.
9. She asked if she could meet with me and I agreed. However on the morning of our meeting I called her and I told her I wasn't feeling well and asked if we could reschedule and she said that was ok.
